

Get ready for a celestial spectacle!

On April 8, 2024, a total solar eclipse will sweep across the continental United States.

- The path of totality—the narrow geographical strip that will experience the total eclipse—will cross thirteen (13) states.
- Elsewhere will experience a partial eclipse.



Total Eclipse 2024 Funding Opportunity

- 50 awards for \$10,000 each
- Funded by the Simons Foundation

- 1. deploy eclipse-related STEM programming
- 2. host eclipse viewing parties for communities
- 3. celebrate scientific curiosity and learning around the eclipse



Eligibility

You do NOT need to be an ASTC member!

But you must...

Be located <u>directly</u> within the path of totality

- Be a science-focused, public-facing, informal learning institution
- Not be a direct recipient of eclipse funding from the Simons Foundation





What does it mean to be "science-focused"?

Science should be central to your educational mission, operations, and programming.

- Science centers
- Children's museums
- Natural history museums
- Zoos
- Aquariums
- **Arboretums**
- **Planetariums**



Who doesn't qualify?

- Public schools
- Afterschool programs
- Public libraries

- Community organizations
- Art museums
- History museums



Project Requirements

Proposed projects must...

- Host—or be a partner to host—a gathering/event during the April 8, 2024 eclipse
- Incorporate educational programming for public audiences
- Be free for attendees

Project Recommendations

Looking for ideas beyond a viewing event? Consider...

- Live interviews with astronomers & scientists
- Interactive demonstrations
- Workshops, e.g., build your own pinhole projector



Funding Timeline

- October 20, 2023: Application deadline
- November 17, 2023: Awardees notified
- December 1, 2023: Awardee kickoff webinar
- December 8, 2024: Funds released to awardees who have returned all paperwork
- January 15, 2024: Awardee check-in webinar to share plans and ideas
- January 9, 2023 April 8, 2024: Implementation of program funding
- April 30, 2024: Final report due

Expectations from awardees

Awardees will be required to...

- Tell the public about their projects (e.g. blogs, news articles, social media posts)
- Submit a final report by April 30, 2024, including:
 - Description of project activities and/or event
 - Photos from project activities / April 8, 2024 eclipse event
 - Estimated number of people impacted by the project



Using the Funds



materials, implementation, printing, staff time, etc

- Supplement existing plans
- Support a viewing party
- fundraising, overhead, passthrough, admissions, etc
- Collaboration is encouraged but funds cannot be funneled to partners
- Promotion/marketing costs are allowable but should be for communities, not tourism campaigns

Application Process

- Applications are open until <u>October 20, 2023</u>
- Briefly respond to prompts to describe your plans
- Project timeline: programming delivered by/on April 8, 2024
- Project budget: \$10,000 (template provided)



Applications are Submitted through Qualtrics

- Must answer "yes" to the eligibility questions to access the rest of the application
- Institutional information, including whether you're affiliated with ASTC or the Simons Foundation (neither is required)
- Project information: pre-eclipse programming (if any), day of programming, audience and estimates of reach, DAIE considerations, community eclipse events and collaboration
- Upload PDFs of budget (template provided) and timeline



Review Criteria

- Proposed activities and scope of work
- Alignment of scope of work with audience and engagement strategies
- Specificity about how DAIE considerations are relevant to audience and scope of work
- Community awareness and engagement
